Eagle Scout Project

The Wantagh Preservation Society would like to thank Scout Richie Monaco of Troop #96 for completing his Eagle Scout Project at the Wantagh Museum this month. Richie coordinated and supervised his fellow Scouts, Scout leaders, friends and family as they worked to clear the trail that runs through the woods from the Museum to the Wantagh Parkway foot/bicycle path. Weeds and overgrowth were removed from the trail's entrance and exit. Adults used chain saws to cut through fallen trees that blocked the trail. Bushes were cut back and the trail was raked and cleared of trash and debris. The trees and bushes removed were then chipped by the adults using a chipper. The resulting mulch was spread on the trail to level out uneven areas. Finally, holes were dug at the trail's entrance and exit. Signs that Richie fabricated for the trail were cemented into these holes.

Richie's Project also involved cleaning out part of the Museum's basement. Shelving units that Richie helped to purchase were assembled and installed along the wall of the basement. The installation included attaching the shelving units to the ceiling to stabilize them.

Wantagh dad Ralph Vaiano (owner of In the Green Landscaping) donated his time as well as the use of the chain saws and chipper. Wantagh Mom, Joyce Sarlo (whose son Michael did his Eagle Scout project at the





Town Board Public Hearing Date: Jackson Cemetery Landmarking

The Town of Hempstead Town Board is scheduled to hold a public hearing during its Tuesday, November 13, 10:30 AM regular meeting, to act on the Town Landmarks Preservation Commission's (LPC's) recommendation that the Town legislature formally approve the Wantagh Preservation Society's "Application for Landmark Designation," for Wantagh's Jackson Cemetery.

Established in 1744, the cemetery contains the confirmed graves of 63 descendants of Robert Jackson. He, along with Captain John Seaman, traveled from Stamford, Conn. and founded this community. In December of 1643, they purchased the area now known as Wantagh from local Native-American tribes. This land transaction was legally documented in the Indian Deed of 1643, according to former Hempstead Town Historian Dr. Myron H. Luke, writing in Hempstead Town in Colonial Times.

According to Cemeteries of Old Wantagh, two veterans are confirmed as being buried in the Jackson Cemetery. One is Thomas Jackson (1754 Dec 24 - 1842 Nov 23), who served during the American Revolution in the Continental Army's 4th Line and 2nd New York Regiments. The second is US Army Brigadier General Jacob Seaman Jackson (1763 May 22 - 1829 Jan 28), who served at that rank during the War of 1812.

At the conclusion of its own 2012 June 19, public hearing, the LPC passed a resolution, by a 5-0 vote, recommending that the Town Board formally approve the WPS application to landmark the cemetery.

The WPS filed its application with the Town of Hempstead to landmark this site on 2011 May 11. The Jackson Cemetery is located on the east side of Wantagh Avenue, immediately north of St. Frances De Chantal RC Church (1309 Wantagh Avenue), and directly across the street from the King Kullen Supermarket (1340 Wantagh Avenue).
