Eagle Scout to Restore Jackson Cemetery

Christian Wendt of Boy Scout Troop 239 will be conducting his Eagle Scout Project on the days of June 21st, 28th and 29th. His project will entail restoring the Jackson Cemetery on Wantagh Avenue in Wantagh (located just north of the St. Frances de Chantal Church). For this project, Christian plans to lead a group of 30-35 volunteers in the clean-up of the grass, repainting of the fence, trimming of bushes and shrubs, cutting down overgrown thorns and branches, removing various stumps, and building a small garden around the cemetery sign. In addition, Christian plans on repositioning crooked headstones and searching for missing headstones in the cemetery that might be buried under ground.

The Wantagh Preservation Society recently obtained Town of Hempstead landmark status for the cemetery. In this historic cemetery are buried early residents of the area including descendants of Robert Jackson who settled here over three centuries ago. Buried in the cemetery is Thomas Jackson who died in 1842. He was a Revolutionary War soldier who served in the 4th Line and the Second New York Regiment. Also buried in the cemetery is Brigadier General Jacob Seaman Jackson, a veteran of the War of 1812.

Christian is in the process of raising the necessary funds for the materials, supplies and tools needed for the project. Donations can be sent to Christian at 3979 Hudson Avenue, Seaford, 11783.

Coming Soon: Spring Yard Sale!

The Wantagh Preservation Society is again holding a "Spring Yard Sale," to be held on Saturday, 2014 May 17th, from 10:00 AM to 4:00 PM (rain date is Sunday, May 18th). If you have sale articles but do not wish to rent space, you may donate them to the Preservation Society table. The Spring Yard Sale is held on the grounds of the Wantagh Museum, on the west side of Wantagh Avenue, opposite Emeric Avenue, between Sunrise Highway and the Southern State Parkway. Publicity for the Spring Yard Sale will be carried online, in local newspapers and posters displayed around the community.

All vendors must complete the application below and send it with a check made out to the Wantagh Preservation Society in advance of the event. Vendors who have not pre-registered will no longer be accepted the day of the event.

Vendor's set-up time is from 7:30 AM to 9:00 AM, and cars being driven onto the grounds to deliver merchandise must be left in the rented \$35 space. Please note that you will not be able to drive a car onto the museum grounds and then drive out after unloading. All cars must be left in a \$35 space – this is a change from previous events. You must leave your car on the Museum grounds until the end of the sale. Vendors provide their own tables and must remove their unsold items and refuse after the sale. They also agree not to leave before the normal closing hour of 4:00 PM.

The rental fee for one space with car that is approximately ten feet wide is \$35.00 and an additional space is \$25.00 (\$35.00 if an additional car is to be left in a space). Spaces vary in depth and the amount of shade, and will be assigned on a "first come, first served" basis. There are no space reservations in advance. No refunds will be made except for rejections.

Merchandise of all sorts, including new sale items, are acceptable. No food or beverage can be sold by vendors. Merchandise must be displayed on tables or on the ground behind the white space markers and within the rented areas. While personal radios are acceptable, there shall be no public address systems.
