## Before the Wantagh Library: The Levine House

The WPS thanks Carol Levine for the photo of the house that used to stand on the site of the present-day Wantagh Library. Carol lived in the home from her birth in 1940 until 1955, along with her parents Dr. Benjamin and Mrs. Ruth Levine, and her brothers Robert and Michael. Growing up in Wantagh, Carol fondly remembers being able to ride horses at a horse farm in North Wantagh.

In addition to being the Levine home, Dr. Levine also ran his general medical practice from the house. The home was previously owned by James M. Seaman (1853-1920). James M. Seaman was a lawyer; his wife was Sarah Elizabeth (nee Baker); their son was James M. Seaman, Jr.

James M. Seaman grew up in a home that still exists on Jones Avenue North (across the street from the Wantagh Library parking lot). The home was owned by his parents James M. Seaman (1811-1891) and Jemima Seaman

(1823-1892). The Levine house was probably built around the late 1800s - about the time when the Seaman-Venier house was built (1860). The Seaman-Venier house is the centerpiece of the Victorian condo complex on Wantagh Avenue (across from the Congregational Church). The Seaman-Venier house was owned by Thomas B. Seaman (1853-1916). James and Thomas were twin brothers. Thomas was instrumental in the naming of the town, Wantagh, in 1891.

## Coming Soon: Spring Community Yard Sale!

The Wantagh Preservation Society is holding the "Spring Community Yard Sale" on Saturday, May 2nd, from 10:00 AM to 4:00 PM (rain date is Sunday, May 3rd). If you have sale articles but do not wish to rent space, you may donate them to the Society table. The Spring Yard Sale is held on the grounds of the Wantagh Museum, on the west side of Wantagh Avenue, between Sunrise Highway and the Southern State Parkway. Publicity will be carried online, in newspapers and posters displayed around the area.

All vendors must complete the application on the last page and send it with a check made out to the Wantagh Preservation Society in advance of the event. Vendors who have not pre-registered cannot be guaranteed admission. Vendor's set-up time is from 7:30 AM to 9:00 AM, and cars being driven onto the grounds to deliver merchandise must be left in the rented \$35 space. You must leave your car on the Museum grounds until the end of the sale. Vendors provide their own tables and must remove their unsold items and refuse after the sale. They also agree not to leave before the normal closing hour of 4:00 PM.

The rental fee for one space with car that is approximately ten feet wide is \$35.00 and an additional space is \$25.00 (\$35.00 if an additional car is to be left). Spaces vary in depth and the amount of shade, and will be assigned on a "first come, first served" basis. There are no space reservations in advance. No refunds will be made except for rejections.



Merchandise of all sorts, including new items, are acceptable. No food or beverage can be sold by vendors. Merchandise must be displayed on tables or on the ground behind the white space markers and within the rented areas. No public address systems are permitted. #### Jamaica Restoration

The photo to the right shows the damage to the Jamaica (the 102 year old parlor car located on the Wantagh museum site) that occurred on Sunday, November 30th. The damage was to the train handle and locking mechanism to one of two gates to the train's observation deck. It appears that someone attempted to get on the observation deck from the side that faces the parking lot, and in so doing completely broke off the train handle and locking mechanism.

A number of people from Wantagh informed the Society that they were at the train on Sunday, taking pictures, and that the train was fine as late as 10:30 AM on Sunday. The train was noticed to be damaged by people that got there at noon on Sunday. So sometime in that hour and a half the damage occurred.

The Society does not believe that this was a case of vandalism; but rather a case of someone wanting to get on the deck. The gate of the observation deck on the platform side of the train is locked for safety reasons and to prevent any damage to the observation deck. The observation deck has another gate which is on the parking lot side: this gate is not locked since it should be obvious to anyone that access to the observation deck should not be attempted from that side. But there are always people who can't see the obvious — and one or more of these people attempted to access the observation deck from that side and in doing so forced the gate open and severely damaged it. Most visitors to the museum complex realize that the buildings and train should be treated with care — some visitors do not.

Although disheartened by the damage, the Society was very thankful for the recent donations that were specifically given for the repair of the damage. So far, donations have been received from Karin Hennessey and Elizabeth Segerdahl, Nancy Turturello, Elizabeth Stacy & Family, and Girl Scout Troop #3015. We are extremely grateful to these Wantagh residents, who greatly value the museum complex. Wantagh is extremely lucky in having such a museum complex which includes the original 1885 Wantagh LI railroad station (houses the Wantagh museum), the original outhouse to the station, the replica of the 1907 Wantagh Post Office and the 1912 Long Island railroad parlor car, the "Jamaica".
