Burglary Prevention Checklist (cont'd)

Securing the inside of your home.

- ☐ Mark valuables with your driver's license number to make them easy to trace if found on a burglar.
- Even if you have an alarm system, be alert when leaving or entering your home. If you notice someone or something suspicious, report it to the police immediately.

The Nassau County Police Department suggests that you keep this checklist handy for future inspections of your home.

ost burglaries are crimes of opportunity. By making the opportunity less attractive, there is a better chance that your home will not be a target.

What burglars look for:

Burglars look for houses that have:

- The appearance of being unoccupied.
- No lights on and are dark at sunset.
- No car in the driveway.
- · Doors and windows blocked by shrubbery.
- · Mail sticking out of the mailbox.
- · Papers on the front lawn or stoop.
- Curtains that are closed during the daylight hours.
- Outside alarm siren boxes.

"Target Hardening" your home:

To help prevent your home from becoming a target:

- · Walk around your home.
- · Make a list for easy points of entry for an intruder.
- Take care of the problems.

Even if you have an alarm system, be alert when leaving or entering your home. If you notice someone or something suspicious, report it to the police immediately.

Securing the *outside* of your home.

Burglary Prevention Checklist (cont'd)

Securing points of entry into your home.

☐ Do not have front doors with side glass panels since they are easy to break and allow the intruder to reach inside and unlock the door.
☐ Use dead bolts with a one-inch throw since the mechanism is difficult to pry or jimmy open.
☐ Ensure that sliding glass doors and windows have metal pins or a metal bar installed to prevent being pried open.
☐ Set inside lights on timers to turn them on at dusk.
□ Do not place valuables in bureau drawers in the master bedroom; this is the first area where a bur-

glar looks.Lock valuables in the attic or basement.
